<u>Antimicrobial Resistance (AMR) in the Real World:</u> Arts & Humanities Research Council invites applications for interdisciplinary research examining ways to meet the threat of AMR in the indoor & built environment. **Deadline 28 Feb 2017.** 

<u>Africa Travel Fund for University of Cambridge graduate students.</u> Financial support towards travel to Africa (Nigeria) for research or study in 2017. **Deadline 10 March 2017.**
