FUNDING OPPORTUNITIES

<u>Cambridge-Africa ALBORADA Research Fund grants</u> of £1k-£20k for research, travel and training involving pairs of researchers from the University of Cambridge (also NIAB, Sanger Institute) and sub-Saharan African institutions, across all disciplines, to initiate or strengthen research collaborations. **25 June deadline.**

<u>Innovation Follow-on Fund</u>: enabling innovation in the UK & developing countries. Call opens 24 May; £1.65m available from NERC to support projects that deliver tangible benefits to end-users, particularly businesses, in the UK or internationally in OECD countries. Open to researchers with current or past NERC funding. **12 July 2017 deadline**.

BBSRC International Travel Award Scheme (ITAS) Up to £3,000, no deadline. Aims to help scientists add an international dimension to their BBSRC-funded research by making and establishing new contacts with international counterparts.

<u>Wellcome Trust Public Engagement Fund</u> open to great ideas for engaging the public in conversations about health-related science and research. £5,000 - £3 million available, no deadline.
